ADVANCED DIPLOMA IN SOCIAL WORK (UK-SPECIFIC)

COURSE OVERVIEW

The Advanced Diploma in Social Work is a comprehensive six-month programme designed to provide students in the UK with advanced knowledge and practical skills in social work. This course covers various aspects of social work practice, including case management, community engagement, mental health support, and policy advocacy, preparing students for careers in social work within the UK. Through a combination of theoretical lectures and hands-on training, students will learn to address social issues, support vulnerable populations, and advocate for social justice according to UK standards and regulations.

CAREER PATH

Graduates of the Advanced Diploma in Social Work will be well-prepared for a variety of careers in the social work field within the UK. Potential career paths include

Social Worker: Providing support and advocacy for individuals and families in need.

Community Development Worker: Working with communities to develop and implement social programmes.

Mental Health Support Worker: Supporting individuals with mental health challenges. **Policy Advocate**: Advocating for policy changes to improve social services and support.

Case Manager: Coordinating care and support for clients.

Researcher in Social Work: Conducting research to advance social work practices and policies.

Child and Family Social Worker: Working with children and families to ensure their safety and well-being

COURSE DELIVERY

The course will be delivered through a combination of in-person and online methods, ensuring flexibility and accessibility for all students. Classes will be held two days a week

Practical Sessions: Hands-on training in social work practices, providing practical experience with social work techniques.

Guest Lectures: Insights from professionals working in various social work fields, sharing their experiences and expertise.

Field Visits: Organised visits to social work agencies, community centres, and other relevant facilities.

Placements: Opportunities for work placements in social work agencies or community organisations, providing practical experience and industry exposure

CERTIFICATION

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be awarded an Advanced Diploma in Social Work. This certification will signify that the holder has acquired the necessary knowledge and skills to work competently in the field of social work

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for the Advanced Diploma in Social Work, applicants must meet the following criteria

- **Educational Background**: A bachelor's degree in a related field such as Social Work, Sociology, Psychology, or a closely related discipline.
- Academic Performance: A minimum 2:1 honours degree or equivalent.
- Language Proficiency: Proficiency in English is required. Non-native English speakers must provide IELTS scores of at least 6.5 overall, with no lower than 6.0 in any component.
- Practical Experience: Basic knowledge and experience in social work or related fields are recommended.
- **Background Check**: Applicants must pass an enhanced DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) check due to the sensitive nature of work in social work
